The Story and Mission Behind AYM Ohio



Faithful in the Little Things

"He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much." Luke 16:10

Some of the greatest lessons in leadership, faith, and integrity are found not in the spotlight, but in the shadows—when no one seems to be watching and nothing seems to be changing. One person that sticks out to me for being faithful in the small details is Joseph. Through betrayal from family and being torn away from everything he knew, and finally being thrown into jail for something he never did, we see him staying faithful with every detail of his life.

Never once do we read of him complaining that he didn't see a path forward, or for the way he was being treated. Likewise, Job was faithful in every area of life. When in the darkest time of his life, he exclaimed "The Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21) Only a continual and steadfast relationship with God and having learned to be faithful in the bleakest of times could have prepared him to endure this severe test and come out faithful. What does our life look like when no one is watching? Will we be faithful now so we can be faithful when the big tests come? May God be able to say "Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy Lord!" (Matthew 25:21)

Faithfulness isn't just about checking off all the boxes. It's about a deep, unwavering dedication to God, grounded in a love that doesn't waver whether we're seen or unseen. May the Lord help us to be faithful always, even when it feels like no one is watching. Because it's in those little moments when we think no one is watching that our true commitment to Him shines the brightest.

Practical ways to be faithful now:


- Cultivate Consistency: Practice diligence, punctuality, and sincerity in all matters, no matter how trivial they seem.
